



St. Ben's Community Services

The Meal at St. Ben's

The meal will be held on **Tuesday**, **June 18**, **2024**. The preparation dates for the stew will be on June 17 and 18, 2024. More information as to the times for everything as well as a sign-up sheet will be available mid-to-late May. I have spoken with one of the coordinators of this meal program and he gave me some very useful information on what the duties of our volunteers will be as well as some protocols that must be followed. I have listed them below.

- We will need 11 volunteers to help serve the meal on June 18th.
- Volunteers will be allowed to have interactions with the guests of the meal. That means that the
 guests will walk through the food line, our volunteers will give each person a tray, then our other
 volunteers will serve the various foods for the meal. St. Ben's has other people who will handle
 taking beverages to the guests.
- Youth are allowed (and encouraged) to volunteer; however, they must be 12 years of age or older and must have a permission form that is signed by a parent or guardian.
- All volunteers must wear either a hairnet or a cap (such as a baseball style cap) in order to follow proper protocols for serving food. If a cap is not worn, hairnets will be supplied at St. Ben's.
- Masks may be worn but are OPTIONAL.
- We will be planning to serve approximately 160 people this year.


As in the past several years, we will be asking for monetary donations to help in purchasing the food needed for the stew and salad that is served. By purchasing all the food at one location and at one time, we can usually get a better price for what we need.

Again, as in past years, we would like to request cookies to be donated. We will need 14 dozen three-inch sized cookies. It would be great if several people donated 2 or 3 dozen each so as not to burden one or two people with making all the cookies. The home-made cookies are greatly appreciated by all those who attend this meal.

We are blessed to be able to help others in this way and it has been a long-standing tradition for St. Olaf. I hope you will consider making a contribution or volunteering for this very important project.

HELPING OUR PARTNERS



As many of you know we partner with All Peoples Gathering Lutheran Church in Milwaukee to provide food, clothing, prayers, and comfort to many in need. We help supply their food pantry, we provide fresh produce during the growing season, we join them in the work that they do, pray for them, and even provide communion bread for them (Thanks Dennis). Someone from St. Olaf's visits them most weeks. Together we can do SO much more than we can individually. I often get questions regarding how to help with this effort. So, I put my thoughts together in the following list to help all of us "Share God's Love and Care for Community. NOTE: Brian Bolling from All Peoples will be at St. Olaf Sunday, May 5th to talk to us. Come and say hi and learn more.

Provide healthy food for the food pantry

- ▶ Look for sales on canned fruits and vegetables or popular items from the list in the entry way at St. Olaf (under \$1 per can, I've found them for \$.49 and \$.79) and let Steve Stretz know. We received a donation from one of St. Olaf's members that can be used to purchase food for their food pantry.
- Purchase an extra food item when shopping. Again, a list of the most popular items can be found in the entry way of the church.
- ♥ Some of you go to Ruby's Pantry. Donate extra healthy food items that you don't need or want. Put them on the shelves in the entry way of St. Olaf and they will be delivered.
- Make a donation to help pay for gas and purchase items.
- Come down to All Peoples and help distribute the food or help older folks carry things up the stairs
- You can help with the Thanksgiving and Christmas food bags

Provide healthy food for the food pantry

- Plant some extra plants in your garden and harvest a few items to bring to St. Olaf.
- ▶ Look for fresh produce bargains at grocery stores. Woodmans, for example, packages items they take off the shelves to make room for new items at a deep discount, like \$1.00 per bag. Purchase them or let Steve know.
- Look out for friends that have extra produce from their gardens.
- ♥ Buy some items at local farmers' markets. Help them and help All Peoples!!
- Help Steve or one of the other gardeners pick produce.
- Come to All Peoples and help at the Gathering Table Garden or help distribute the produce that they receive (the normal St. Olaf day is Wednesday).
- Donate to help purchase seeds and supplies for St. Olaf gardeners or to purchase produce

Prayers and encouragement are always welcome. You are always welcome at All Peoples to join them in worship. From St Olaf it takes a while but is an easy and safe trip

Women of Grace Meeting

The next meeting of the Women of Grace (WOG) will be on Monday, May 13, 2024, at 3:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. All women of St. Olaf, and guests, are welcome to attend our meetings and offer suggestions and/or help for the projects that may be coming up. This meeting will include a special informational discussion via Zoom with Bryan and Desiree Camp who will explain their involvement in the Wycliffe Bible Translators. Pastor Tom has been able to connect with them and is very interested in the possibility of the Women of Grace helping to support these two missionaries in their work of helping to translate Bibles into other languages "so that every man, woman, and child will be able to have God's Word in a language and form they clearly understand." Anyone interested in hearing about this very vital work is welcome to attend this program. We will hold the program portion of the meeting at the very beginning of our meeting (so very close to 3:00 p.m.).

Other discussions will include the St. Ben's meal and preparations needed for this important event in June as well as other topics that may come up. Refreshments will be available.

Searchers

The Searchers Bible study group meets every Tuesday at 9:00 a.m., most usually at the home of Jane Christenson. Various Bible studies are utilized for our discussions. We have the opportunity to pray for the people and things on our hearts, and then to learn something new and enlightening from each of the studies.

The *Gather* Magazine study will be used on May 14 2024. This is a stand-alone Bible study. It is entitled "Compassionate Companions: Congregations can play a role in mental health ministry". It is described on the "Gather" Magazine website as follows: "As long as humans have existed, there has been mental illness. By some estimates, as many as 20% of all adults live with a mental health issue. In biblical times, mental illness was often misunderstood and thought to be caused by demonic possession. In modern times, we have learned much more about brain chemistry. Although the stigma around mental illnesses has decreased, we still have a long way to go, and our faith communities can help. Looking particularly at biblical people and passages that relate to living with mental illness, the May 2024 devotional reminds us of Jesus' compassionate care for those who struggle. Together, we'll learn how congregations can become "stigma-free" zones, welcome and support those with mental health issues and their loved ones and provide opportunities for all ages to learn more about a topic that affects us all."

Copies of the study will be available for anyone who does not subscribe to the magazine. Please feel free to join us for this very important and timely study.
